Policy Statement

This policy is written, and the Early Education Funding delivered, with regard to the relevant statutory and local authority guidelines. Such guidelines are subject to updates. At Surbiton High School we aim to ensure that funding is delivered in a way which best supports parental access, whilst still ensuring the future sustainability of the school.

Eligibility for Early Years Funding

A child is eligible to receive Early Years Funding for up to 15 hours per week until the Term in which they turn 5 years old. The hourly rate is determined by the Local Authority and is currently £5.49 per hour (Autumn Term 2022/23). The School will apply for this funding on behalf of a parent. In order for us to do so, we are required by the Local Authority to obtain an application form from each parent. This must be updated by the parents on a termly basis until their child is no longer eligible for the Early Years Funding. We are also required to obtain documentary evidence of a child's date of birth. Due to timings of the payments from the Local Authority, Early Years Funding is deducted from the Termly Fees Invoice in arrears, starting from the Spring Term Invoice.



The Government has offered an additional 15 weeks' funding, in certain circumstances. Parents can visit www.childcarechoices.gov.uk to find out about the different childcare offers for them, check eligibility for the 30 hours and generate an eligibility code.

1. Admissions

Admissions to the School are made upon completion of the application process. This begins by completing the online Application Form found on our website. On application, parents must provide evidence that their child has permission to study in the UK. Non-UK/EEA Nationals should provide a copy of the applicant's passport and visa to show their current status and the dates of study and expiry of study.

Boys' Prep School

Registration for entry to Reception at our Boys' Prep School for 2024 onwards can be made at any time (but not before birth). On receipt of the completed application form and the non-returnable fee of £100 parents receive written confirmation of their son's Reserved Place, providing no waiting list is in operation. A formal confirmed offer will follow in February of the year prior to entry and a non-refundable deposit will become due by end of February. On receipt of the acceptance form and payment of the £1000 deposit, it will become a Confirmed Place. When confirmed pupil numbers reach our maximum class size, we will then add a child's name to our waiting list and a confirmed place entry will be offered, where possible, after the closing date.

Girls' Prep School

Registration for entry to Reception at our Girls' Prep School for 2024 onwards can be made at any time, prior to 1 November the year before entry (but not before birth). There is a non-returnable application fee of £100. Once registered, children are invited to attend a 'Stay and Play' session in School, during November or early December of the year prior to entry. This session will allow the child to explore our fun and exciting learning environment, meet our inspiring staff and get to know other prospective pupils and allow us to observe your daughter in our Early Years setting. Offers of places are made following the 'Stay and Play' session.



Sibling Priority

Whilst we welcome applications from siblings of children who already attend the School, places are allocated on merit only. When allocating places, priority is given to siblings and the children of members of the School community or part of the United Learning group of schools, who have performed to the required standard in the entrance examinations. A sibling is defined as a child sharing at least one natural or adoptive parent with another child who is currently a pupil at the School, or who has accepted a place at the School

1. Delivery and Charges

Early Years Funding is available for 15 hours per week over the Term time period at a rate per hour determined by the Local Authority. Due to the timing of the payments from the Local Authority, Early Years Funding is deducted from Fees Invoices in arrears. Details of School Fees can be found at www.surbitonhigh.com/admissions/fees

2. Additional Charges

Upon acceptance of a place at the school a deposit of £1000 is payable. Please refer to www.surbitonhigh.com/Fees for further information about the deposit and school fees.

3. Parental Declaration

In order to receive Early Years funding, parents must complete a declaration, provided by the School, each term within deadlines. Receipt of the funding is dependent on this form being completed.

4. Queries and Complaints

At Surbiton High School we aim to work in close partnership with parents and ensure relationships are based on mutual respect. To this end, we want to know when things are, in the view of parents and/or pupils, not going right. If parents have any concerns about any aspect of their son or daughter's education, we ask that they contact a member of staff as soon as possible. Parents are assured that all such expressions of concern will be treated seriously and followed up courteously and promptly. If you have a query or complaint in the first instance you should contact the Head of the Girls' Prep or Boys' Prep School. The School operates a three-stage formal complaints procedure which can be found on the School website.
