#### Chart 2.0a SPC Chart - Results from A-Level qualifications only.




Chart 2.0a shows the value-added scores for A-Level qualifications for Surbiton High School that have been analysed by Alis since 2010. The shaded areas represent confidence limits, the green area a 95% limit and the tan area a 99.7% limit. If a value lies within a shaded area, then the value can be deemed as 'normal' whether it is negative or positive. It is only when the value falls outside the shaded areas that the value can be deemed significant, thus implying that some factor in the teaching and learning, external to the students, has contributed to the value.

#### Year 13 leaver destinations:

Over 91% of our students will be heading off to their first-choice university and further to this, we have maintained our success rate of applications to Russell Group and Times Top 10 Universities, and medical or dental schools, with 95% of students heading to these prestigious destinations, and six students have accepted their places at Oxford and Cambridge Universities. This is despite a more challenging year for competitive entry courses. The remainder of our students are heading off to study at international universities and some of the most prestigious drama schools, conservatoires and art colleges.


