



SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE

Our Sixth Form students are role models within our community, and there is an expectation that they will dress in a way that is supportive of our smart, purposeful, working environment. Our dress code allows students individuality whilst also giving guidance on items of clothing/footwear which are not appropriate to wear in School. This dress code does require students to make a personal judgement of what is and is not appropriate for a school environment.

As general guidance, the following items of clothing should not be worn to School:

- Ripped denim or clothing (smart denim is allowed)
- Sportswear, for example, leggings and tracksuit bottoms etc. except for Games afternoons
- Shorts
- Tops with plunging necklines or that leave the shoulders bare, or clothes which leave a bare midriff
- Visible underwear
- Open-toed shoes e.g. flip flops and sandals
- Ugg-type boots
- Clothing carrying slogans, large logos etc.
- Hats may not be worn within the school buildings
- Piercings must be discreet and supportive of our code in Years 7 to 11
- Should a student choose to have a tattoo, it

must not be visible when at School

- Hair should be of a natural colour
- For formal events, such as Prize Giving, open events etc., it is expected that students will wear smart, formal clothes i.e. a suit or similar.

The final decision about what is or is not acceptable rests with the Heads of Years 12 and 13, and the Director of Sixth Form. If a student is not sure whether a piece of clothing is acceptable or not, it should not be worn. A student who is improperly dressed in School will be asked to rectify their clothing. If it is not possible for a student to rectify their clothing in School, they will be asked to return home to change, and parents will be informed.
